ARE EDUCATIONAL INDEX.

The warden of the state penitentiary says "If Oregon votes wet we will need our new addition to the state penitentiary and a new building but if Oregon votes dry we will have plenty of room in the old building." Shall we vote for saloons and spend our money for booze, penitentiaries, and insane asylums or shall we vote dry and spend our money for our homes, our public schools, our Normals colleges etc?

THE ISSUES.

Three measures, one saloon and two temperance. 1—The Home Ruin bill or the revision of the infamous Reddy bill defeated in 1908 by a majority of 12994 but the saloon bunch are making a tremendous campaign to deceive the people in this tricky bill. Don't be deceived by a name. VOTE 329 X NO. 2—Constitutional Prohibition is the next logical step: 21 counties now dry, only 13 wet. Let's finish the job. ALL CRIMINAL LAW IS PROHIBITORY. VOTE 342 X YES

We need a just equitable workable law to enforce prohibition and the people will enact it by VOTING 344 X YES. BUNCOMBE

Nelson's Encyclopedia defines buncombe as "Tall-talk oratory intended to GULL rather than to enlighten". Isn't that a correct description of the saloon bunch's speakers? Here's a few samples: 1—They say the Home Ruin bill is not the infamous Reddy bill: just read the two bills, BUNCOMBE. 2—If prohibition law is passed officer's search daughter's room at midnight for liquor: the search and seizure law has been in force in Oregon ever since territorial days, is now in our constitution and in the constitution of the U. S. and every state of the union and every civilized country in the world. It is in our Local Option law in force in 21 counties

in Oregon. More buncombe. 3—Prohibition doesn't prohibit: we have hundreds of murders in the U. S. annually. Shall we repeal the law and license men to murder? Thousands of men convicted of stealing: shall we repeal the law and license men to steal? Prohibition doesn't prohibit any crime but does lessen crime and law against the iniquitous liquor traffic is as well enforced as the average American law. More buncombe. Juggling with figures, plain and fancy lying etc. give you more samples of buncombe. In contrast with the saloon buncombe we give you facts and arguments you can easily prove to your own satisfaction.

1—THE ECONOMIC ARGUMENT. The saloon is a parasite feeding on but NEVER creating prosperity. The present movement which must lead to the annihilation of the saloon is a business man's movement based on business sense.

2—THE CRIMINAL ARGUMENT: The saloon is the most prolific cause of crime. Grand Jury of Jackson county says "The business of the criminal division of the circuit court comes from saloon towns." The Mock-Smith murder case is typical. Medford gets license money but all taxpayers of county pay the bills for trial. Committee appointed by Massachusetts legislature reported "26,672 crimes committed in state in one year; 22,514 by drinking men and 21,873 criminals under influence of liquor when crime committed."

3—THE HOME ARGUMENT. The saloon is a trap for our boys and girls. We need schools for our boys and girls BUT do we need saloons for them? The saloon is the enemy of the home.

4—WORKINGMAN. Saloon is enemy of the workingman: 1—It takes his wages "the poor man's bank that never pays its depositors." 2—A dollar invested in hats and caps gives labor 37 cents, in books 38 cents but invested in beer labor gets .02 and in whiskey labor gets .01.

5—THE FINISHED PRODUCT of our schools is a trained mind and a boy or girl fitted for a useful life BUT the finished product of our saloons is a blighted mind, a wasted life, a debauched manhood and premature death.

6—THE SCIENTIFIC ARGUMENT. Alcohol either in small or large doses is a poison and lessens a man's brain power, physical endurance and efficiency. The Lancet (leading medical paper of the world) says "It is unrivalled in producing degeneration."

7—ARGUMENT OF EXPERIENCE: ASHLAND, EUGENE, CORVALLIS, ALBANY, McMINNVILLE and many other prosperous Oregon cities dry and glad of it. They like "prohibition and prosperity."
