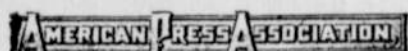

MUST PRESENT ORDER

Before obtaining papers from files in Clerk's office.

Judge Calkins has made an order which in substance is as follows:

When an attorney wishes to take papers in any case under the jurisdiction of the circuit court from the files in the clerk's office, he must present an order signed by the circuit judge and must receipt the clerk for documents taken out.

The reason for the order is that so many of the attorneys who take out papers from the files forget to return them and when the case is called the papers are missing, often delaying the business of the court until a hunt for the missing papers is instituted. The order is not intended to work a hardship on anyone, but is simply a wise precaution taken to expediate the transaction of business before the court.

TO CUBA

In an aeroplane is the stunt contemplated.

Havana, Nov. 21.—A flight from Havana to Key West in an aeroplane is the latest thriller to be contemplated by aviators. An offer to fly over that route was made today by John B. Moissant to President Gomez of Cuba. Moissant is seeking the aid of the Cuban chief executive in promoting a two weeks' aviation meet in the island, and would terminate it with the attempt be proposed.

The feat is considered one of the most hazardous ever attempted by bird-men. Practically the entire flight would have to be made over water. This might not seem so bad were it not for the knowledge that a man would be torn to pieces within a few minutes after he struck the water by man-eating sharks that infest the sea in those waters.
