

SHOULD MAKE DEMAND
For Convention to Amend the Constitution.

The legislature should pass a resolution making a formal application to Congress for the calling of a National Convention to amend the Constitution so as to provide for direct popular election of United States Senators.

The Constitution provides that upon the application of two-thirds of the States Congress "shall" call a Convention for the purpose of proposing Amendments, which become operative when ratified by three-fourths of the States.

So by making such application the States have power to force the Senate either to assent to the calling of the Convention or to itself adopt the desired Amendment for submission to the States, thus obviating need for a Convention. The House of Representatives has four times passed such an Amendment, but as many times the Senate has rejected it.—Ex.

LETTER FROM O. A. C.
Experiment Work in Oregon Will be Extended.

Corvallis, January 2.—Word has been received by President Kerr, of the Oregon Agricultural College, from the authorities at Washington that the support of the Federal Government is assured for the extension of the agricultural experimental work in the state of Oregon.

Letters and telegrams from Samuel Fortier, chief of the Bureau of Irrigation Investigation at Washington, and from Dr. Carlton, stating that the appropriations for the work in Oregon will, in all probability, be passed by Congress.

The plans for the extension of this work have been presented to the Board of Regents of the College and have been approved by them. The assurances from the Federal Government that they will be in a position to co-operate with the state in this work leaves the matter ready for presentation to the state legislature. The state will be asked to provide only one half of the cost of maintenance. The various localities in which the work will be carried on have offered to furnish the land, fences and other equipment.

The work will be carried on in co-operation with the Agricultural College. Experiment stations are to be established in central Oregon, southern Oregon and extensive irrigation experiments will be carried out in the Willamette Valley. The Central Oregon station will be concerned principally with experimental work in dry farming. The Southern Oregon station will take up investigations in horticulture, dairying, vegetable raising and other branches of agricultural work. The irrigation experiments will be carried on throughout the Willamette Valley for the purpose of determining what can be done to increase the productivity of this section of the state.
