LIEUTENANT-GOVERNOR

New Office to be Created by Amendment to Constitution

Salem, Jan. 18.—Creation of the office of lieutenant governor, as proposed in a resolution presented by Senator Calkins yesterday, seems likely to command strong support at this session of the legislature. Impetus is given by the recent anomalous situation in the state when Secretary of State Benson, called upon to perform the duties of governor, was compelled by ill health to turn over the office to the president of the senate.

The Calkins resolution provides for the submission of a constitutional amendment at the election of 1912, so the people may pass upon the question. It provides no salary for the lieutenant governor aside from a per diem unless called to fill a vacancy in the gubernatorial chair.
