Because some unforeseen difficulties have arisen is no reason why the council should "lay down" in the matter of constructing waterworks. Almost every municipality has encountered obstacles in the path of progress, the overcoming of which but served to make the value of the improvements more apparent. The aim of the council to secure a water supply for the city is a laudable one, and although mistakes may have been made there is no good reason why the proposition should be abandoned; the difficulties and set-backs that have been encountered should rather serve as a spur to further and more careful work in the future. The majority of the citizens have shown by their votes at the bond elections that they want water and we believe will insist that the matter be carried forward to a successful issue. Stick to it, the people are backing the proposition.

Work on the water system is at a standstill and it seems likely to continue so for the present at least. Efforts are being made to effect a settlement with Mr. Mears, the contractor whereby the city will take over the uncompleted work, material, etc. and relieve him from further duties in the matter. An estimate of all work done and material furnished, has been made by the engineer and a proposal submitted which if accepted will sever his connection with the work.

RESOLUTION

A Resolution Suspending Work on construction of City Water Works by Contractor James J. Mears, under his contract with the City of Jacksonville of date November 25th., 1910 for the construction of said Waterworks, on account of a violation of said Contract by the said Contractor, James J. Mears and ordering and requiring Notice thereof to be served upon said Contractor and his surety, Pacific Surety Company.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF JACKSONVILLE, JACKSON COUNTY, STATE OF OREGON:

SECTION I. That, whereas, James J. Mears, Contractor with the City of Jacksonville for the construction of City Waterworks, under contract of date November 25th., 1910, has heretofore, to-wit: on the 13th. day of February, 1911 filed with the City Recorder a complaint refusing to comply with the instructions of the City Engineer, T. W. Osgood, relative to the performance and execution of said work in compliance with the terms of the aforesaid contract; and,

Whereas, said Contractor by his conduct and acts has so failed to comply with the instructions of said City Engineer; and,

Whereas, said refusal is a direct and positive violation of the terms of said contract causing great damage to the City of Jacksonville and which damage will be greatly augmented with each additional days work in violation of the instructions of said City Engineer and in violation of said contract;

NOW, THEREFORE, the said Contractor, James J. Mears, is hereby ordered and required to stop and desist from the further prosecution of work and labor and the furnishing of material under the terms of the aforesaid contract or otherwise until the further written order of the City Council.

SECTION II. That the matter of said complaint of James J. Mears be investigated by the City Council and the City Engineer is hereby required to file a report setting forth specifically the failure or failures of said Contractor to comply with the instructions of said Engineer and the terms of said contract and that thereupon the City Council take final action in the premises.

SECTION III. That the said Contractor be notified of the order and requirement of this Resolution by personal services upon him by the City Marshal of an Order and Notice in the following form, to-wit:

To James J. Mears:
You will please take notice that your written refusal to comply with the instructions of the City engineer, T. W. Osgood, in reference to the performance and execution of that certain contract of yourself with the City of Jacksonville of date of November, 25th. A. D. 1910 for the construction of a water works, which refusal you filed with the City Recorder on the 13th. day of February, 1911, and which you have since orally reiterated and carried into effect by your conduct and acts, is a direct and positive violation of the terms of your contract aforesaid and you are hereby required and ordered to desist and stop all further prosecution and performance of work and labor and the furnishing of material in accordance with the terms of said contract or at all until the further written order of the City Council so to do.

And you are hereby further notified that the City of Jacksonville will not pay for or be responsible for or accept any work, labor or material expended or used under the terms of said contract or otherwise after the date hereof until the further written order of the City Council.

And you are likewise further notified that you and your surety, PACIFIC SURETY COMPANY, a Corporation, organized and existing under the laws of the State of California, will be held to a strict performance of said contract and for any damages resulting to the City of Jacksonville from the violation thereof.

This notice and order is served upon you by order of the City Council of the City of Jacksonville, pursuant to a Resolution duly and regularly adopted at a regular meeting thereof held at the City Hall on the 14th. day of February, A. D. 1911. Dated this 15th. day of February A. D. 1911.

That the service aforesaid shall be made by the City Marshal by personally and person delivering to the said James J. Mears a notice and order in the aforesaid form duly signed by the City Recorder and said Marshal shall thereupon make return of such service by his certificate endorsed upon a true copy of said notice and order served and file the same with the City Recorder.

SECTION IV. And the City Recorder is hereby ordered and required to notify Pacific Surety Company, a corporation, organized and existing under the laws of the State of California, and its President of the aforesaid violation of said contractor with the terms of said contract and of the action of the City

Council in the premises by depositing a duly certified copy of this resolution in the United States Postoffice at Jacksonville, Jackson County, State of Oregon, securely sealed in an envelope legibly directed to the President of the aforesaid Pacific Surety Company at its principal office at San Francisco, State of California, and upon which postage shall be fully prepaid and the said mail shall be duly registered with due request for return receipt endorsed thereupon.

And the City Recorder shall thereupon make return of such service under his certificate attached to the registered mail return receipt.

The foregoing resolution was passed by the City Council of the City of Jacksonville, Jackson County, State of Oregon, on the 14th. day of February, A. D. 1911 at a regular meeting duly convened for said purpose, by the following vote:

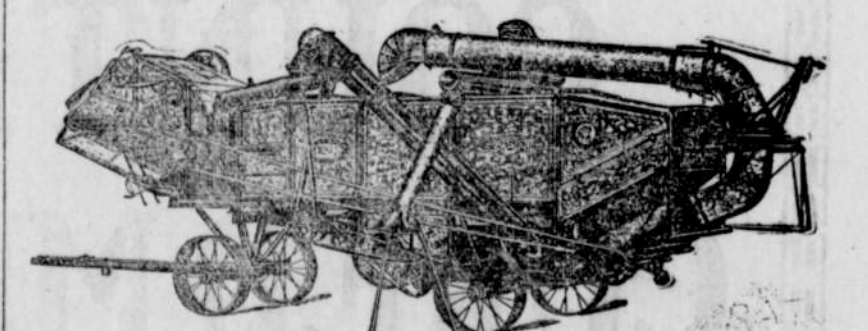
