The people who came to this country in early days were very much in earnest, and they rapidly made useful citizens. The great areas of unowned lands and natural opportunities drew them out from the city and on to the farms which they cleared or settled from the wild. Now, these great natural opportunities are corralled, held at prohibitive and speculative prices beyond the reach of the poor immigrant. The foreign born workers huddle in the cities, beat down wages, drive out the American workers, and even in the country they are too often made tenants of intermittent laborers. The remedy is not so much in restricting desirable immigrants as in opening up the land. There is room for a million European workers in Oregon alone, but not unless we clear away the paper cobwebs that would rackrent and despoil them more cruelly than the lords and loafers of Europe.
