Although the excitement caused by the recent order for the mobilization of the United States troops upon the Mexican frontier has subsided, the public at large are still at sea in regard to the meaning of the order. Some claim that it was in order to protect the interests of American capitalists who have invested largely in Mexican property; others just as earnestly maintaining that it was in defense of the "Monro Doctrine": that foreign powers, notably Japan, were about to secure footholds upon Mexican soil and that this demonstration was intended as a warning to such powers to "keep off the grass." The reason given out by the government, that it is simply for practice and drill purposes, has not been taken seriously by anyone; the general impression being that something serious lies at the bottom of the matter. Whatever the cause' time will doubtless soon reveal it and until such time that it shall be revealed it will be well to reverse judgment as to the necessity or wisdom thereof.

It is generally conceded that bank statements are an index of the condition of financial affairs in a community and if this is true, then from the statements of our banks published this week there can be no question as to the prosperity of the citizens of Jacksonville, the reports showing that the deposits have increased over forty-four thousand dollars in the past two months. Beekman's Banking House show deposits of \$145,955.16; Bank of Jacksonville \$51,426.13; total \$197,381.29, estimating the population of our city at 1000 people, this shows an average of almost \$200. for each man, woman, and child in the city, which showing is excelled by few towns of this size anywhere. 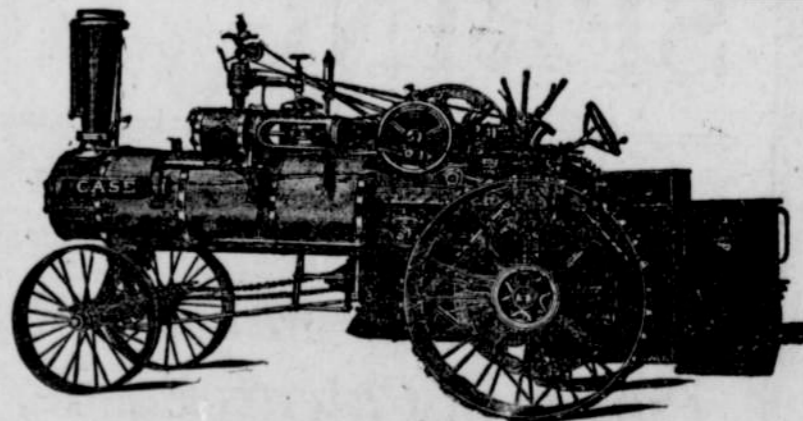
