The grand jury in their report to the circuit court, declares that a new jail is a necessity and recommends that one be constructed at once. It is expected that the matter will be taken up at the next session of the county court. That part of the report regarding the jail, was in substance as follows: We have examined the county jail and we find the same entirely inadequate to hold and care for the number of prisoners now being confined therein.

We recommend that an entirely new jail be constructed with a view to segregating prisoners with regard to their age and experience as criminals and differences of character. As matters now stand, boys charged with petty offenses under sentence from justice courts may be and are cooped up with alleged murderers and white slavers. Three months confinement in the county jail under these conditions may convert a lad who has been a petty offender under sudden impulse into a deliberate criminal with definite plans equipped with technical knowledge of the means to the end. Since reformation is gaining ground as a chief end of punishment it were better that young men and boys charged with misdemeanors go unpunished than to confine them in a jail such as ours. Crime just budding may rapidly mature under the hot house growth vicious criminal associations naturally compel. A jail large enough and with proper arrangement for the wide segregation of criminals according to their age and experience is a need so imperative and insistent that construction of such a jail should be hastened with all possible dispatch. The report contains some unwholesome truths; it is an undeniable fact that the present jail is entirely inadequate for the present needs and we venture the assertion that nine-tenths of the taxpayers of Jackson County, after a visit to and examination of the present structure, would insist upon the immediate construction of a modern building, of proper size, and arranged with a view to the health and welfare of the unfortunates whom for the welfare of society it may be necessary to incarcerate therein.

The State of Oregon vs. Barney Ballard. Indicted by grand jury for larceny. On motion of District Attorney defendant was allowed to enter a plea of guilty of simple larceny. Defendant waived further time and asked for immediate sentence. Sentenced to two months in county jail, sentence to be suspended during good behavior.

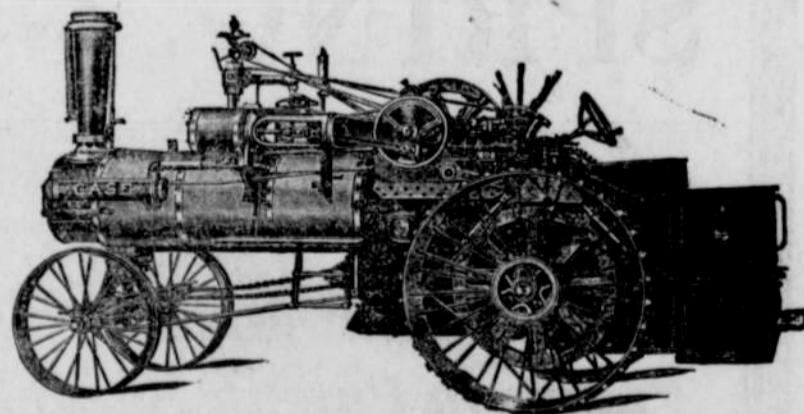
