CORVALLIS LETTER

Foreign Born Student's Entertain at the O. A. C.

Corvallis, Oregon, April 25.—The Cosmopolitan Club, an organization of foreign born students at O. A. C. representing India, Japan, Russia, Germany, Scotland, Canada, England, Norway, South America, and the United States, gave a clever entertainment recently, the program of which included many instructive and amusing features.

After a piano solo by Miss Vena Rickard, an associate member, and an address by the president, J. K. Fairchild of Portland, giving a history of the club since its organization a year ago for the purpose of bringing together the foreigners to become acquainted, to form international friendships and forward thus the cause of international peace, the 29 members answered roll call with quotations of authors from different nations all over the world. Hindu magic was demonstrated by T. Khankhoje of Wardha, India, and an address on "Poetical Japan" was given by S. Nishisaki of Jamaguchi. An International Quartette, composed of two Japanese a Norwegian and an American, sang Home Sweet Home, each employing his own language and all singing at once.

After a description of historical origin of the Japanese sword dance by Khankhoje, the performance, with naked swords, was given by Kaku Okamoto of Kumamoto, Japan, while the song-poem accompaniment was given by Moichi Kawashima of Tokyo. R. E. Duncan of Portland represented the negroes with a well-rendered selection from Paul Dunbar, the negro poet, and Prof. J. B. Horner concluded the program with an address on the Nile country and methods by which the American agricultural colleges can aid Egyptians by establishing up-to-date methods of rice culture.

With his \$1,000 savings Burt made his first payment on his little farm, built his house and barn with his own hands and began to farm it as farming should be done. With only seven acres of land for cultivation, Burt sowed three acres to alfalfa and around the home he planted a small orchard; between the trees he planted berries and vegetables; under every tree he placed a bee-hive so that the bees might pollinize his trees while storing for him their golden honey. He kept on planting and sowing things until every foot of land was made to do double and treble service. Still he had left sufficient to devote to a chicken yard, a pigsty and a cowpen. In the year 1910 Burt took from his seven acres a total of \$2,003 and with his aggregate savings he purchased forty acres more of river-bottom land.—Sunset Magazine.
