Appropriations for U. of O. Will be Held Up for Present.

A news letter sent out from Salem, Wednesday, states that Mayor Abrams of Cottage Grove, and H. J. Parkinson filed their petitions Tuesday afternoon, for referring the appropriations for the University of Oregon at Eugene.

On the petition for referring House Bill No. 210, there are 12,475 names, and on the other petition, referring House Bill No. 211, there are 12,424 names.

RESTORATION TO ENTRY OF LANDS IN NATIONAL FOREST.
