

A Distinguished Visitor.

Last Sunday Mr. Ernst Skarstedt, the foremost Swedish-American literateur, called on his life-long friend O. N. Nelson, accompanied by Hon. J. A. Westerlund of Medford. Mr. Skarstedt has just published a book about the Swedish people in Oregon, being the last one of a series of historical volumes in regard to that nationality on the coast. As a historical and critical writer on various artistic subjects, he takes a high rank; and his vivid description of the wonderful resources and scenery of Oregon will be extensively read by the cultured class in Sweden, partly on account of his prominent connection, as his father was one of the leading educators in that country, and one of his brothers is a member of the supreme court in Stockholm. Mr. Skarstedt greatly admired Mr. Britt's gallery, and became enthusiastic over the idyllic scenes in Jacksonville, expressing the hope that every ancient land-mark and every old building would be retained in its original oddity.
