THE NEW CHARTER.

The result of the election Wednesday was a victory for the progressive forces; the charter submitted by the council receiving 112 votes for its adoption, while only 20 were cast against it, some of those who voted No did so by mistake, hence the majority for the charter should have been one or two larger.

One or two persons it is said opposed the charter because it provides for the appointment of the marshal and street commissioner by the council instead of electing them by popular vote as under the old charter. This we believe is a step forward toward the commission form of government; anyway it is the proper method and is used in most cities of the United States, and has proved very satisfactory. The principal objection alleged against this method is that it gives the mayor and council power to remove such officers at pleasure, etc.; this is no valid reason whatever, while it is true that appointive officers can be removed at the pleasure of the power appointing them, it seems to us that this is, in the case in point, a decided advantage rather than an objection. As the mayor and council are responsible for the welfare, safety, etc. of the city and its inhabitants and are also charged with the supervision of the streets and highways within the corporate boundaries it is only just and right that the power to appoint, with the right to remove these officers be given to the council, as provided in the new charter.

The amendment proposed by the initiative petition was defeated by a vote of 107 to 32. This was as it should be: the present boundaries of the town were established by an act of legislature in 1889, and after existing for 22 years there is no good reason why the corporate area should be diminished now. This seems to be the view taken by most of the voters Wednesday, and their decision will doubtless be accepted as final.

The election is over, now drop all petty quarrels and get in line for the improvement and progress of our city. Speak a good word for your home town in season and out of season. Have faith in its future and show that faith by your works.

ENCAMPMENT AT ASHLAND.

Grand Army Will Give Comrades a Rousing Reception.

Plans are being made by the local G. A. R. Post, assisted by kindred associations and the Commercial Club, for the entertainment of the several hundred old soldiers and their friends expected at the state encampment to be held here on the 27th, 28th and 29th of this month.

Arrangements have been made for the reception of the visiting veterans on Tuesday, the 27th. They will be met at the station by the reception committee and taken in autos to headquarters, probably at Armory Hall, where rooms will be assigned. The same evening there will be an address of welcome by Mayor Neil and a response by one of the visiting delegates. This will be followed by a program of music and recitations.

The veterans will hold their business meetings during the day and the evenings will then be given up to entertainment. Wednesday evening a cantata will be given. This is under the direction of Mr. Froberg. After the business session of the third convention day has been concluded, a banquet will be given, followed by toasts and music.

Arrangements for the trip of the delegates through the valley from Ashland to Medford, which will be one of the enjoyable features of the convention, are well under way. The Medford post is co-operating in this and auto owners of the two cities will give the use of their cars for this purpose. It is intended to send the delegates away with a first-hand idea of the beauties of the Rogue River valley.—Tidings.

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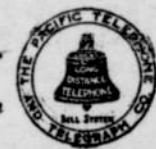
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
