PROCLAMATION OF THE MAYOR OF THE CITY OF JACKSONVILLE

I, T. T. Shaw, Mayor of the City of Jacksonville, hereby certify that a certain Act entitled:

AN ACT

To amend an act entitled "An Act to Incorporate the Town of Jacksonville, Oregon," approved October 19, 1860, and as amended by an Act entitled "An Act to amend an Act entitled 'An Act to Incorporate the Town of Jacksonville, Oregon,' approved February 14, 1887; and as amended by an Act entitled 'An Act to amend Section 1 of an Act approved October 19, 1860, to Incorporate the Town of Jacksonville, and an Act to amend Section 4 of Article VI of an Act to amend an Act entitled an Act to Incorporate the Town of Jacksonville, approved February 14, 1887, and an Act to amend Section 2 of Article IV of an Act to Incorporate the Town of Jacksonville, approved October 19, 1860,' approved February 19, 1889; and as amended by an act entitled 'An Act to Amend Section 2 of Article IV of an Act to Incorporate the Town of Jacksonville, approved October 19, 1860,' filed in the office of the Secretary of State February 18, 1891; and as also amended by an Act entitled 'An Act to amend Section 2 of Article IV of an Act to Incorporate the Town of Jacksonville, Approved October 19, 1860,' filed in the office of the Secretary of State February 22, 1893; and as also amended by certain proposed charter amendments submitted to the voters of Jacksonville at an election held therein the 24th day of June, 1909, and approved by said voters at said election, entitled as follows:

ORDINANCE NO. 123.

The People of the Town of Jacksonville do Ordain as Follows: That there be and hereby is proposed the following Amendment to an act entitled "An Act to Incorporate the Town of Jacksonville," enacted by the 1st legislative assembly of the State of Oregon, approved and signed by the Governor of the State of Oregon, October 19, A. D. 1860, and all acts or parts of acts amendatory thereof, the same being the Charter of the Town of Jacksonville and which Charter and Act when so amended shall be made to read as follows:

AN ACT

To amend an act entitled "An Act

to Incorporate the Town of Jacksonville," enacted by the 1st legislative assembly of the State of Oregon, approved and signed by the Governor of the State of Oregon, October 19, A. D. 1860, and all parts or part of acts amendatory thereof, the same being the charter of the Town of Jacksonville, and to enact and provide a complete charter in the place thereof for the government of the City of Jacksonville and therein providing for a change of the name of said municipality from the name of "Town of Jacksonville," to the name of "City of Jacksonville," and therein providing and defining the geographical corporate limits and boundaries of said city; providing for a city council and all municipal officers, their election, appointment, term of office, powers and duties providing the police powers and regulations of the city and the manner of the exercise thereof; providing a municipal court, its officers, powers, authority, jurisdiction and procedure and the powers and duties of its officers; providing power and authority for the punishment by fine, imprisonment and labor, one, both or all, for the violation of any ordinance, resolution, crime or police regulation; providing for the exercise of the right of eminent domain, the purposes for which private property may be condemned by the city and the procedure therein; providing for what act and improvements special benefit assessments may be levied, upon what property, the manner and procedure therein and the collection and payment thereof providing for borrowing money on the faith of the city, the issuance of warrants and bonds and limitation of indebtedness; powers and purposes of taxation and the collection of the same; providing and defining the qualifications of electors at all elections and the manner of conducting the same; the manner and procedure of exercising the Initiative and Referendum powers reserved to the municipality by the Constitution of Oregon; and fully providing and defining all and every power and authority of the council of the City of Jacksonville and the City of Jacksonville and fully providing for the government of the City of Jacksonville and everything needful and requisite to maintain, establish and promote the peace, good order, health, cleanliness, ornament, prosperity, general welfare and government of the city and to protect the property and persons of its inhabitants.

Which was submitted to the legal voters of said City of Jacksonville at a special election therein held on Wednesday, June 21, 1911, for their adoption or rejection, received the affirmative majority of the total number of votes cast thereon at said election, viz: 112 votes for said Act to 20 votes against said Act; and I accordingly hereby make proclamation of the adoption of said amendments to the charter of Jacksonville in accordance with the provisions of Ordinance No. 135. Done at the City of Jacksonville, this 29 day of June, 1911.

BASEBALL AT PALMER CREEK

Jacksonville Invincibles Victors in a Fast Game.

In one of the fastest games ever witnessed, the Jacksonville Invincibles defeated Palmer creek last Sunday by the score of 10-7. The game was played on one of the fastest fields in the county. Every once in a while somebody would get on bases and make a great slide or a great bone head. The many thousand who witnessed the game declare they never saw anything like it. The Jacksonville infield is certainly some fast. It is made up of old stars, including Gus Tepper who formerly played first base for Pittsburg, Huckleberry Finn with Chicago last season, Little Willie McAcintacle three years with Detroit, and Jack Miller five seasons with Toledo. The outfield includes such stars as Coffman, Ennis thirty three years with the twenty mule team of the Borax League, and Cantrall who has played all his life with Applegate. The battery is made up of Coffman and Dunford two of the fastest men who ever played with the Haymaker's League.

 Miller on third played a star game, grabbing a line drive out of the mighty waters of Big Applegate, and also getting ten hits out of three trips to the plate.

In the ninth inning with all the bases full and three men on third the mighty Coffman, (who played left field) came to the bat determined to win fame, wound up in a knot and let fly, the mighty Coffman meeting the pill fully on the nose with all his might and sent it away, away, very near to the pitcher and cleared the bases, there being two out all-ready.
 It was in the seventh that Ennis (who is one of the best in the business) made a star catch of a high fly. After a great run (during which time he did not move out of his tracks) he missed the ball in deep center.
