The delivery of the bonds and receipt of the money to be
within thirty days from date of the agreement.

Oregon Sidelights.

September 1 is to be postcard day in
Klamath county. Klamath county in
the county fair are to be boosted.

A street clock 12 feet high and 30
inches in diameter has been set up
by A. J. Metzger, a Curvallis jeweler,
before his place of business.

Port Orford Tribune: The planer is
now running and the shingle mill is
cutting 35,000 a day. The demand is
unlimited for Port Orford cedar
shingles.

The Baker Herald describes a sam-
ple of oats brought in by J. H. Taylor
from his Badger Flat ranch near Au-
burn. Stocks were 6½ feet long and
one head had 238 kernels.

The Marshfield News says there has
been less wind at Marshfield this sum-
mer than for many years. The News
notes the recurrence of "the usual
summer northwest wind."

James Snipes presented to the ed-
itor of the Dalles Chronicle two fine
peaches, the largest 11½ inches in cir-
cumference, 13 ounces, the smaller
10½ inches and 19 ounces.

The Klamath Falls council has passed
an ordinance granting a 50 years' gas
franchise. The plant is to be in op-
eration within 12 months. The maximum
rate is to be \$1.75 per thousand l.

C. M. Maupin, a California oil man,
tells the people of Bandon that Coos
county has the best prospects for a
great oil field of any county he was
ever in, and he is a man of 22 years'
experience in the oil drilling business.

Salem Statesman: Large grain
yields are reported from many sections
of the Willamette valley. One large
field near Stayton produced an average
of 54½ bushels to the acre; 35 to 45
bushels is common. Oregon soil
against the entire world anyway.

Albany Democrat: The value of an
electric line to the country section is
shown in the fact that between Port-
land and Salem, 49 miles, the Oregon
electric has 41 stations—some regular
stops, some flag stations. In 19 miles
on the Hillsboro road there are 17 sta-
tions. The electric line is a builder of
pretty homes and settlements.—Jour-
