As mentioned in another column, under the head of "Council Meeting," the difficulties in the way of the council, in the construction of the waterworks appear to have been overcome, in a monetary sense at least. The Jacobsen-Bade Company agreeing that in the event Morris Bros. fail to take the bonds in a reasonable time, the company will accept the bonds at par in exchange for the construction of the system including the dam on Jackson creek, the gravity pipe line to the reservoir, the reservoir and the main pipe line from the reservoir to the intersection of Fir street.

The distributing system, consisting of the mains and laterals along the principal streets of the city will be constructed under the "Special benefit assessment plan," that is the cost of the distributing system will be assessed against the property benefitted in proportion to the benefit accruing to such property by reason of the construction of the system. An opportunity will be afforded the property owners to pay such assessments in ten annual instalments, under what is known as the "Bancroft Act," the cost of construction to be paid out of funds arising from the sale of improvement bonds issued by the city under the provisions of chapter XIV of the city charter. The adoption of this plan for the construction of the distributing system will require about forty days in which to give the notices, etc. required by the charter, but it is confidently expected that by the time the contractors have finished the dam, gravity line, reservoir, etc. that the contract for the distributing system can be let and the whole system completed before winter weather sets in.

CIRCUIT COURT

E. C. Aylor vs M. E. Bryant, et al. Order sustaining demurrer and allowing plaintiff ten days in which to further plead.
S. J. Majors, et al vs Joseph T. Gagnon, et al. Motion of plaintiff for judgment upon the pleadings denied.
Portland Wood Pipe Co. vs James J. Mears. Judgment for plaintiff by default and consent of defendant.

State of Oregon vs Peter Genatos. Defendant was indicted by the grand jury for assault, being armed with a dangerous weapon, and having heretofore plead not guilty, was given a jury trial. The following named persons composed the jury: George C. Culy, A. K. Earhart, Tyson Beall, George A. Givan, Ralph Jennings, H. C. Cole, J. T. Eads, E. A. Burchell, G. W. McNabb, James Kershaw, W. E. Anderson, B. J. Trowbridge. Prosecuting attorney Mulkey, represented the State and Mess. DeArmond Bros. the defense. After hearing the evidence, the arguments of counsel and the charge of the court, the jury returned a verdict of guilty as charged.

Spaulding Manufacturing Co. vs Mrs. S. J. Erdman. Demurrer to complaint overruled and defendant given ten days in which to further plead.

Emma Pauley vs William Pauley. Decree for plaintiff by default.

State of Oregon vs B. Riddle. Defendant appeared in court and withdrew his former plea of "not guilty" and plead guilty as charged in the indictment.

State of Oregon vs Jack O'Neil. Dismissed upon motion of the prosecuting Attorney.

State of Oregon vs William Baxter. Case continued, defendant released upon his own recognizance.

Givan, C. H. Gillette and W. E. Anderson. The defendant was charged with larceny of goods from the store of Martin J. Reddy, in Medford, July 4, 1911. The defence undertook to prove an alibi and it seems succeeded, for the jury returned a verdict of not guilty.

State of Oregon vs Peter Bouzos. Indicted for attempting to bribe an officer. Defendant plead not guilty and case came up for trial Wednesday afternoon. The state was represented by C. L. Reames, and the defendant by E. E. Kelly. The jury was empaneled and sworn, after which the court declared a recess until Thursday morning. Verdict guilty.
