THE BENEFICIAL ASSESSMENTS

As considerable misunderstanding seems to exist in regard to the matter of constructing the distributing system of the waterworks, we submit the following brief description of part of the plan. As the authority for making these assessments is purely statutory the charter provisions must be strictly adhered to. Under the provisions of our city charter the Council is authorized and empowered to make certain improvements specified in chapter XIV and to assess the cost or part of the cost thereof upon the property specially benefitted thereby; this is the method adopted by the council for defraying the cost of constructing the distributing system of the proposed waterworks.

The charter gives the council full power to decide as to the extent and character of the improvement to be made; to set out the limits of, and to create the district to be assessed for such improvement, also to ascertain and declare the amount which each lot or parcel of land in such district is benefitted by the improvement and from their decision there is no appeal except in case of fraud. A majority of the property owners however, may within 15 days after the publication of notice of intention to make such improvement, file with the city recorder a written remonstrance against such improvement, but such remonstrance may be overcome by the unanimous vote of all the members of the council.

After the work has been actually commenced and the exact cost ascertained a proposed assessment will be made and due notice thereof given to each owner of property liable to such assessment, and also fixing a time and place when and where objections to such assessment will be heard. When the assessment is finally confirmed the council will by ordinance arrange for the payment of the same in ten annual installments and will issue and sell the "Improvement Bonds" to cover the cost of such improvement.
