CO-OPERATIVE STORES

In Portland Plan to Reduce Cost of Living.

Portland, Ore., Dec. 14.—Co-operative grocery stores, controlled by a corporation and in which the general public holds all the stock will be established soon by a committee of business men to be appointed by Mayor Rushlight.

The plan of combating high cost of living was brought about the attention of the city council and Mayor Rushlight, who asked that the council empower the mayor to select a committee to establish the stores.

This committee will handle the affairs of the co-operation until it is solidly established and permanent office is elected.

Shares in the venture will be sold at \$25 and only one share can be held by any one individual.

Profits will revert to the stores' customers in proportion to the amount of their purchases.

According to its promoters to day the stores will be extended throughout the state if the scheme proves successful in Portland.
