A mass meeting for the nomination of candidates to be voted for at the election March 5th, was held last night and resulted as follows:
Mayor: T. T. Shaw.
Councilmen, Two years: Emil Britt, Lewis Ulrich.
Councilmen, One year: Fred Fick, J. I. McIntyre.
Recorder: S. C. Whittington.
Treasurer: J. M. Cronemiller.
For Councilmen for 2 years there were five candidates: Emil Britt received 75 votes, Lewis Ulrich, 58 votes, E. E. Oman 23 votes, Fred Fick 22 votes, and Ernest Langley 18 votes.
For Recorder S. C. Whittington had 61 votes and Henry G. Dox had 36.
It is likely that an independent ticket will be nominated by petition during the next week.
