W. LOUNSBERRY ROBS TRAIN

Is Wounded in Fight. Owns Orchard on Central Point-Jacksonville Road.

Topeka, Kan., Aug. 23.—The post office officials of this place Friday afternoon positively identified the robber who was shot and seriously wounded by his own revolver while resisting capture after he had robbed the mail car on the Union Pacific Colorado Limited train No. 101, near Lawrence, as Wells Lounsberry of Medford, Oregon, a former railway mail clerk. Lounsberry formerly ran between St. Paul and Jamestown, N. D., on the Northern Pacific railroad. He was identified by means of a letter found on his person addressed to Mrs. Lounsberry at Medford. It is estimated that \$2500 was secured from the registered mail.

Wells Lounsberry, wife and two children, live on a ranch next to the Daggett place on the road between Central Point and Jacksonville. He came to Medford five years ago from St. Paul. Few men have more warm personal friends or a better reputation for honesty than Lounsberry enjoys here. Friends believe that he was demented at the time of committing the robbery as he was at one time injured on the head in a train wreck and they believe this affected his mind.

Oregon Sidelights.

The building of cement sidewalks at Hillsboro is vigorously in progress.

Montelle Coe is about to establish a commercial greenhouse at Bend, the first in that city.

Domestic science and manual training have been added to the high school course at Albany.

M. S. Pate has been engaged as principal of the Enterprise public schools. He is a Nebraska man.

The Crook county court, according to the Bend Bulletin, has promised to aid to the extent of \$1000 in drilling a public well "at the intersection of the old Prineville road with the Bend to Burns road."

Oregon City Courier: The Elks' handsome new home is almost completed, and is one of the handsomest in the state. The order has a strong membership here and is steadily growing.

Banks Herald: Quite a bit of country road has been macadamized in the Roy Centerville, Forest Grove and Hillside districts, and when winter sets in the farmers in these districts will be able to market their produce at a third of the cost heretofore.

Moving picture artists are at work in the salmon canneries about Astoria, The Budget says: "These pictures, when completed, will be an advertisement of great importance to Astoria, as they will be shown all over the country as an industrial educational feature."

Bend Bulletin: A gravel and sand pit has been opened in the field on the east side of the river opposite the Bend company's sawmill. W. A. Bates says an excellent quality of both materials is obtainable and it is to be used in the concrete construction of the new electric power plant.

Estacada Progress: Without a dissenting voice, the tinkle-tinkle ordinance has been amended allowing livestock to roam the streets until 8 o'clock at night instead of 7 o'clock. Alderman Hawkins said it hustled owners to get supper and take up their stock by 7. So 30 days hence, livestock must be tucked in their little beds from 8 p. m. to 6 a. m.—Journal.
