Mrs. Frank Clancy died at the Minor Hospital, Seattle, at 2 o'clock a. m. Saturday, August 31, having failed to rally from a dangerous surgical operation. The body was removed to the home of Mrs. Clancy's sister, Mrs. Walter Eyres, of 1611 Fir Street. Mrs. Clancy was 49 years old and is survived by her husband and one son, Herbert, who is now at Manila aboard the United States transport Dix. Born in Yreka, California, she came to Seattle twenty-seven years ago and two years later married Frank Clancy. She later induced her three sisters to come North and all married there. The sisters surviving are Mrs. Eyres, Mrs. Archie Lamb and Mrs. James Rhoades. Mrs. Clancy was formerly Miss Maude Cimbourski, and resided for a time in this city. Her father and mother are buried in the Jacksonville cemetery.

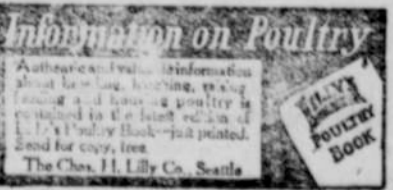
