

## NEWS IN BRIEF

### Indian Keeps Word.

George Gray, a Klamath Indian sentenced to sixty days imprisonment for giving away liquor on the Klamath reservation, has proven that he is a man of his word. At the time Gray was sentenced he asked United States District Judge Bean to suspend sentence for two months that he might return home and harvest his crops. The request was granted and at the expiration of that time he returned to Portland and gave himself up. The birth of an heir was the cause of Gray's trouble. He felt so happy he obtained a quantity of liquor and shared it with his neighbors.

### New Star Mail Route Ordered.

Commencing last Tuesday a new star mail route between Derby and Prospect is in operation which will serve the residents of upper Rogue River with a daily mail service. Heretofore Prospect has been served with mail three times a week from Eagle Point by way of Trail.—Tribune.

### Lost 36 Hours in Storm.

While fishing in a skiff at Crater Lake Friday of last week, Mr. Stewart a resident of Klamath Falls and Dr. Berg of the same city encountered a heavy wind and rain storm, the wind blowing so hard as to drive them across the lake, where they effected a landing near the "Wine glass." By this time it was dark and camp was made for the night. Saturday morning Manager A. L. Parkhurst and the engineer of the Crater Lake company embarked in a motor boat and started in search of the lost men. They succeeded in finding the makeshift camp of the fishermen, but the storm was too heavy to permit a return trip until Sunday morning, when the entire party returned, worn out by fatigue and exposure.

### Marvelous Wheat Crop.

Wheat averages six feet in length with heads averaging six inches, estimated to yield 100 bushels to the acre, is grown by "Gardener" Enoch M. Smith on a four acre farm near Gold Hill. Mr. Smith is an ardent agriculturist, yearly raising bumper crops on his small plot of land. Among other marvels he produces a seed and seedless squash upon one vine. Mr. Smith claims that four acres of Jackson county land is enough for any farmer.

### Many Dead Salmon.

A complaint made by Grants Pass citizens that dead salmon littered the banks of the river in that city, caused an investigation to be made by City Attorney Colvig and Chief McLane this week and as a consequence a man has been employed to do away with the nuisance. Citizens residing along the banks of the river complained that the stench had become unbearable. Chief McLane counted 255 dead salmon in the course of a short stroll along the river bank.

G. T. Shaw has a pair of owls built along unkey lines. Possessing the face of a monkey, the eyes of an idiot, the wings of an eagle, the claws of a chicken, the lightning spirit of a tiger and a noise like the exhaust of an S.
