41-Acre Ranch Sells for \$11,000.

R. A. Pierce has purchased a 41 acre alfalfa ranch just north of Central Point from J. E. Nichols, paying \$11,000. The place is entirely under water and is said to be an exceptionally good purchase at the price. The deal was made by the Clark Realty company of this city.—Tribune.

Will Vote on Local Option.

The county court of Josephine county has called an election to get the sentiments of the citizens of that county on the local option question. Grants Pass has been dry for a number of years. The question will be brought up at the time of the general election in November.

"Made in Medford Day."

Medford is planning a big celebration for "Made in Medford Day" Sept. 19. A big parade consisting of police officials, band, militia, lodge organizations, school children, fire department, rough riders, floats, autos, etc., will be the main attraction, followed by a "made in Medford" ball at the Natatorium in the evening. Liberal prizes are offered for the best merchants', orchards, school and lodge floats, as well as the best lady equestrian.

Joyriders Beware!

As soon as the present session of circuit court is over, Prosecuting Attorney Mulkey and Sheriff W. A. Jones propose to make joyriders' lives a burden to them. Complaint on the part of parents who object to their daughters being out late at nights is one of the prime causes leading to this move. Joyriders appear to favor the Medford-Jacksonville road and it is nothing new for our citizens to be disturbed at all hours of the night. An Oregon state law says auto excursionists out after midnight, on pleasure bent, may be arrested under the statute defining vagrancy.

Ducks After a Record.

Mrs. Ralph Billings has two ducks which are claimed to have all previous records put to sleep. They were hatched March 23 last and began laying about three weeks ago. Yesterday each duck laid an egg in the forenoon and repeated the record in the afternoon, laying three good, hard-shelled eggs and one soft-shelled one in one day. When Mrs. Billings went out to the coop this morning she found another egg. Can anyone beat this for a laying stunt?—Ashland Tidings.

Wind Damages Orchards.

The wind storm in the valley last Thursday afternoon did considerable damage to the Commice and Bose pear orchards and it is estimated that the crop was cut from five to ten carloads as a result. These varieties were nearly ready to pick and the wind brought many to the ground. The Medford papers state that the Hillcrest, Bear Creek, Burrell, Randall and other orchards containing Bose and Commice varieties suffered considerably. The A. C. Allen orchard was protected by a large stand of timber. Over 150 carloads of pears from Jackson county have gone to the market already and the shipments are expected to reach 300 cars.—Ashland Record.

Bullmoose a Legal Party.

Salem, Or., Sept. 11.—The Progressive party is now a legal organization in Oregon. Over 7000 names were on the petition filed yesterday afternoon, a few hours before Colonel Roosevelt's arrival in Oregon. The petition was filed by O. M. Hickey of Portland, and George Rodgers of Salem. The law requires not less than 5 per cent of the legal voters of the state for the creation of a party. The legal number needed was 5661.
