

U. S. Has 13 Frisky Nieces.

Washington, Oct. 28.—Again facing the possibility of armed intervention in Cuba, Uncle Sam, tonight, found himself practically assuming a protectorate over a territory in Central and South America, which is half as large as all Europe. Dollar diplomacy and the Monroe doctrine combined have forced the United States into the position of being a very practical guardian to 13 republics.

How strong is American dominance in the situation is indicated in dispatches tonight that the Conservative party in Nicaragua has nominated Adolfo Diaz for president. American marines have been "cleaning out" Nicaragua. Reports say there will be no other candidate for the presidency, mainly, it is assumed, because Diaz is persona grata to the United States.

Dispatches from Santo Domingo told that President Victoria has agreed to retire.

W. T. T. Doyle, the state department agent, now in that country, announced that 750 American marines will remain at Santo Domingo city "until the affairs of the Island Republic are satisfactorily adjusted."

There are nine other republics to the south, where affairs are now strictly under influence from Washington—Hayti, Guatemala, Salvador, Honduras, Costa Rica, Panama, Venezuela, Colombia and Ecuador. In several American are administering the customs.

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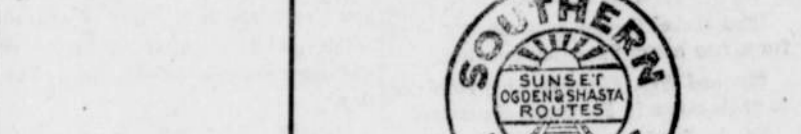
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
