### REGARDING A SEWER SYSTEM.

The writer has always maintained that the installation of a sewer system would do more to settle the controversy regarding the water rates than anything else, and at the same time would assist very materially in placing the water department upon a paying basis as with a sewer system there would be some inducement to put in and maintain bath rooms, toilets, etc. in the residences thus creating a use for the water the whole year, while at present the average householder has use for the water during the present months only.

The sewer system need not of necessity co-incide with the boundaries of the water districts as the water mains cover some territory which at present does not need sewers, a main trunk line on the principal street, with perhaps a few short laterals on others would be all that is required at the present.
