REGARDING A SEWER SYSTEM.

The matter of the construction of a sewer system is receiving considerable discussion the past week. We understand that the Ladies Civic Club think of asking the city council that the matter be taken up at an early day. This is a matter of more importance to this city than the change in the national government from a republican to a democratic administration and is worthy the careful attention and earnest support of every citizen.

The writer has always maintained that the installation of a sewer system would do more to settle the controversy regarding the water rates than anything else, and at the same time would assist very materially in placing the water department upon a paying basis as with a sewer system there would be some inducement to put in and maintain bath rooms, toilets, etc. in the residences thus creating a use for the water the whole year, while at present the average householder has use for the water during the present months only.

The sewer system need not of necessity co-incide with the boundaries of the water districts as the water mains cover some territory which at present does not need sewers, a main trunk line on the principal street, with perhaps a few short laterals on others would be all that is required at the present. Later on, laterals could be laid connecting other streets with the main trunk as needed. The septic tank could be made of sufficient capacity to serve for years. The cost of such a system need not be large and if assessed upon all the property benefited would not be a heavy charge upon any while the benefit arising therefrom in convenience, sanitation and progress would be immense and lasting.

President Hibben of Princeton presided at the ceremony. The wedding was simple. As Miss Frances Folsom, Mrs. Cleveland was the first white house bride. She became engaged to Prof. Preston several months ago. The wedding took place in Prof. Hibben's home here, only the members of the immediate families and a few intimate friends of the couple being present. An attempt was made to keep the news of the wedding secret until tomorrow and an hour after the ceremony, flat denial that it had taken place was made. It had been generally believed the marriage was to have been deferred until after Easter. It is stated the couple will leave tonight for Florida to spend the winter.
