## THE SCHOOL DISTRICT REPORT.

In another column appears the report of expert Wilson who has made an examination of the books of this school district as ordered by the voters at the last school meeting. The report which is voluminous, covers the 1907-8, up to and including the first part of the present year and shows the money received from various sources and at different times; the disbursements made and the purposes for which money was disbursed.

The report shows the present indebtedness of the district to be \$9500. of which \$2500. is secured by the bonds of the district and the balance, \$7000. is outstanding warrants. Against this indebtedness we have the value of the school property: building, furnishings, fixtures, apparatus, etc.

In the report Mr. Wilson states that everything goes to show that the funds of the district during this period had been disbursed for legitimate purposes, but calls attention to the poor system and methods used in keeping the accounts. The report is worthy a careful reading by every taxpayer in the district.

Mrs. Krusek was instantly killed and Mrs. Eddy died in fifteen minutes after being struck. Parties in the house a few feet from the tree that was struck were more or less shocked, but none was seriously injured.
