## ROBBERY AT BUXTON

\$2000 in Money and Checks  
Taken and Thieves Leave  
No Trace Behind.

Forest Grove, Or., Sept. 10--The large general merchandise store of Gregerson & Kilberg Brothers at Buxton, near here, was last night entered by burglars and the safe in the office of the store blown open, the thieves getting away with \$1000 in money and \$1000 in checks. The latter, taken in as cash in the course of business, had not yet been intorsed by the firm.

The robbery was discovered early this morning when the members of the firm appeared to open for the day's business, and the store was kept closed until the officers could make an investigation. Sheriff J. E. Reeves of Hillsboro, was notified, and he went to Buxton early to investigate, but there is thus far no clew to the thieves. The banks in the surrounding towns were notified to refuse payment on the checks.
