Antics of Volcanoes.
Some curious antics are performed by volcanoes in action. On the island of Savili, in the Samoan group of the south Pacific, a fissure opened late one day in a cocoa plantation. An eruption took place immediately, devastating the whole island. After an eruption by Mount Taal in Luzon, Philippine Islands, five lakes, all of different colors, were left in the crater. Katmai, in Alaska, spread its volcanic dust around the world in less than a month. Mount Pelee threw a rock plug through its crater nearly 2,000 feet high in a few days. The plug has since sealed until only the stump is left. Rindalsen, in Japan, blew its own head off and then belched streams of hot mud. When the island of Krakatoa, near Sumatra, was destroyed by volcanic shock the report of the explosion was heard 2,000 miles away. Cotopaxi, in Mexico, once broke loose so suddenly that the snow on its summit was scattered over the surrounding country as blocks of ice.—Kansas City Times.
