It contained no cherry bark extract or balsam.

# No Real Cure Possible From In National Forest. State will Receive Almost Half a Million Dollars

The district forester at Portland, Oregon, announced today that the Pel ican Bay Lumber Co. of Klamath-Falls Oregon were the successful bidders on tigating under the Food and Drugs Act the sale of the largest body of government timber ever advertised by the Forest Service in Washington or Qre- .. 1

The sale jucludes two units, one of . The 85 million feet of yellow-pine and other species on the west side of Klamath Lake, and a second unit of about \$ 800 million feet of nearly pure vellow pine located just east of Crater Lake National Park. The prices on unit I are \$3.00 per M. for pine and 50 cents per M. for other species; and the prices on unit II are \$3.37% per M. for pine and 51 cents per M. for other species.
