England's Daily War Bill Near \$25,000,000.

London, Feb. 15-In parliament today Premier Asquith said that the forecast made several weeks ago of a daily expenditure for the war of \$25,000,000 had proved to be nearly accurate, and there were no prospects that the amount would be reduced. Obligations incurred by the war, he added, would impose a serious strain on the country for a generation to come. This burden he believed, could be met only by large additions to taxation and by maintenance of England's credit by keeping up the volume of exports, holding down unnecessary imports, and reducing expen
