Chiefest Need in Preparedness

The fearful battle that has been raging around Verdun for the past ten days no doubt has received close study on the part of those who are making out a plan for preparedness for this country. Those works built of steel backed by cement and supposed to be impregnable, have been reduced to atoms by the German cannon.

After our great war Admiral Farragut made a visit to Great Britain and the continent. Remove Stigma of Illegitima!e Births.

Portland, Or., March 8-If the parents of an illegitimate child are both unmarried, they should be forced to the only heir to an estate valued be- satisfactory manner and hereby solicit and give it a name, said Judge W. N. Gatens in an address at the W. C. U. mid-year gathering vesterday at Centenary Methodist church. The child is always innocent, and must be protected, he continued. If the father is married he should at least be forced to support the child. At present the father is under no legal obligation at all. Even if he has agreed in writing to support the child, the agreement cannot be enforced, according to a supreme court ruling. Since the mother bears all the rest of the burden, the father at least should shoulder the economic part of it, he concluded.

-----Switzerland Must Get Ships

Geneva, March 6, via Paris-Switzerland will be compelled to charter trans-Atlantic steamships to bring her own food across the sea under protection of her own flag if the war continues much longer, in the opinion of many persons here. The view is expressed that Germany's program at sea may mean the starvation of Switzerland unless some such action is taken. -+3+
