#### Washing Colored Clothes

In washing colored clothing, the co!ors should first be set by soaking in a strong salt solution, say the O. A. C. domestic science specialists. Colored clothing should not be boiled. Boiling water, lye, soda, strong soap or stain removing agencies, except of the mildest kind, should be avoided. After washing, the clothes should be hung in the shade and ironed on the wrong side if possible.
