## The Price of Sugar

The putting up of the price of sugar to an altogether unreasonable figure, the week after the tariff upon sugar is assured for three years to come, is what makes free traders in the United States.

The average man is too dull to see any occasion for the outrageous advance. Men of capital in this region can make more interest on their money in sugar making with sugar at four cents per pound, than in any other steady business that they can engage in. To double that price to consumers for no cause except that they can get away with it may be in the strict line of business, but it makes clear that when, six months ago, they were, with tears in their eyes, telling how many poor men would be thrown out of employment if the Underwood bill should take effect as originally intended; their tears were not for the poor men, but merely tears of self-pity lest their power to rob the people should be abridged.—Ex.

## Forest Notes

Oregon consumes annually over 2,200,000 cords of fuel wood, which, reduced to board feet, amounts to over 1,105,000,000 feet.

Oregon produces annually approximately 1,610,000,000 board feet of logs, but consumes over two billion, or 27½ percent in excess of her log production. She draws heavily on Washington for this excess.

Oregon produces approximately three and one-third million linear feet, but consumes only about one-half a million feet.

Oregon produces over two billion feet of lumber, approximately 160 million lath, and 275½ million shingles. Of this quantity, she consumes nearly 23 million lath and over 116 million shingles. Of the amount of lumber produced, Oregon consumes 19.8%, or 411 million board feet, over half of which is used for building material, of the lath and of the shingles is used in Multnomah and Clackamas Counties.

The railroad of Oregon consume over 18,000 hewn ties and the mines 22,000. Oregon also consumes 65,000 linear feet of round mine material.

The State of Washington consumes annually over 3,300,000 cords of fuel wood. Reduced to board measure, this amounts to approximately 1,672,000,000 board feet.

The State of Washington produces approximately 5½ billion board feet of logs annually, but consumes only a little over 4½ billion board feet. The balance is sent to Oregon for manufacture.

Washington produces approximately 8½ million linear feet of poles and piling, and consumes about six million linear feet.

The railroads of Washington consume over 675,000 hewn ties, and the mines of the State consume 33,500 hewn ties. The State also consumes over ten million linear feet of round mine material.

Washington produces annually more than 4½ billion feet of lumber, nearly half a billion pieces of lath, and over 8½ billion shingles. Of this quantity, she consumes only 2½% of the shingles and 12½% of the lath. Of the lumber produced, she consumes 17½%, or over 700 million feet, about two-thirds of which is used for building purposes. About one-fourth of the building material, of the lath, and of the shingles, is used in King County.

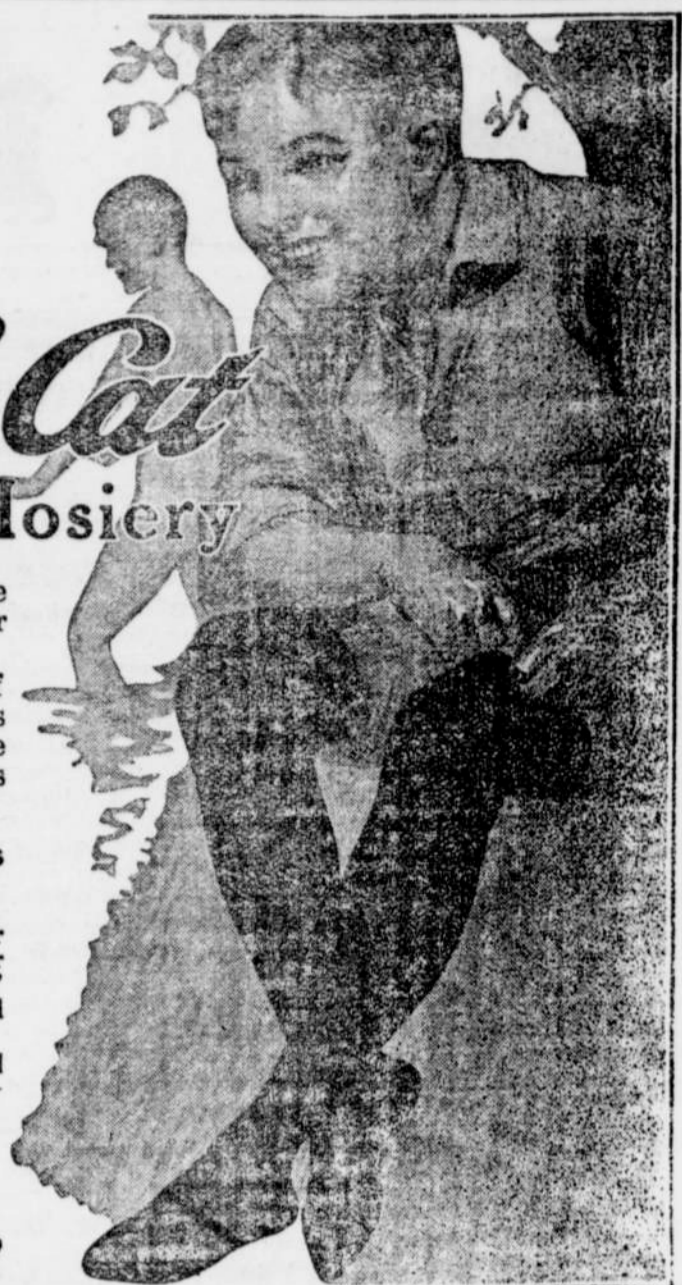
