Sale of Timber in Nat. Forests

District Forester at Portland, Oregon has just opened bids on two small sales of timber on National Forests, one on the Olympic Forest in western Washington, and the other on the Crater Forest in southern Oregon.

The sale on the Olympic Forest consists of 1,725,000 feet of western red cedar and Douglas fir sawtimber and 3,500 cords of western red cedar shingle bolts, not far from Port Townsend, Washington. This sale has been awarded to the Snow Creek Logging Co., who have already purchased other large bodies of timber in the vicinity; the prices paid are \$1. per M for the sawtimber and 50 cents per M for the shingle bolts.

The sale on the Crater Forest consists of 390,000 feet of sawtimber most of which is yellow and sugar pine. The timber is on a tract of approximately 45 acres bordering one of the tributaries of Klamath Lake. This sale has been awarded to Brown Bros. & Hubbard, and the prices paid are \$3.20 per M for the western yellow pine and sugar pine, and 50 cents per M for the Douglas fir, white fir and incense ced-
