Centralia, Wash., April 19—The North Coast Power company, owner of the electric line between here and Chehalis, is contemplating reducing the fare between the two cities to 10 cents.

At present the fare is 15 cents or a round trip ticket for 25 cents. To offset the reduction in revenues the company will operate its cars on the one-man plan.
