## End of the Revolt

Revolt in Ireland is crushed. The revolt in Ireland was not an Irish revolution in the true meaning of that term. Irishmen—those who boast that there is pride and honor in the fact of being an Irishman—have no sympathy with the disloyalty that reached a crisis in Dublin. That class of Irishman considers the revolt as against Ireland and the Irish name quite as much as against England and the English. There has been nothing in the movement of which the Irishmen whom the world admires is not ashamed and does not condemn.

Thoughtful people who believed they knew something of the true sentiment and situation in Ireland are not surprised that this incipient rebellion has been so rapidly crushed. There has been no general acceptance of the statement that the disaffection was widespread and deep-seated in Ireland. There was faith that the best traits of Irish character were predominant in that country and that the "Michael Feeneyism" of the land, however incited to treachery and however well led, would speedily come to grief. Events have approved this opinion.—Telegram.

## Banks Must Report Sums Sent to Europe.

Washington, May 3—The controller of the currency has taken steps to ascertain to what extent American banks have financed European nations at war. Revised blanks, mailed to all members of the federal reserve system to be used in the next bank call, require each bank to report the amount of bonds, obligations or acceptances of foreign governments it holds.

The banks of the country, official analysis of the showing on the last call discloses, were never in a stronger position before and it is believed that the time is opportune for disposing of reports that the amounts lent on foreign securities are unduly large.
