A Lame Excuse

Villa's lieutenant, Lopez, in prison, gives a purported reason for Villa's invasion of American territory; that Villa believing American cans would not fight, but that the American government was playing one Mexican chief against another to have them kill each other off, and then take in all Mexico, is but a sorry subterfuge for a thief who never has any respect for law "until he feels the halter drawn." Mexican bandits have been dragon's teeth in that distressed country for a hundred years. To wait until they all kill each other off would be an impossible job. Villa delighted in posing as a valiant hero and patriot, but all the time he was ready to assassinate a sick woman or little child if necessary in order to steal a horse without being suspected. Rheumatism Reaches Heart

Oregon, City, June 6—Ben Eby, a brother of O. D. Eby, an Oregon City attorney, died last night at his home in Goshen, Lane county, after an illness of several years. His death was primarily due to an attack of inflammatory rheumatism that had affected his heart. He was aged 40 years and is survived by a widow. O. D. Eby left yesterday afternoon for Cottage Grove to see his father, who is seriously ill there, and his brother died at Goshen after his arrival.

Youthful Inventor gets big Offer for Engine.

Roseburg, Or., June 6—David Kingery, son of J. W. Kingery, has been offered \$55,000 for the patent of a new type of gas engine, which he recently invented. This engine will afford double the power with little over half the weight of the present light engines, and it is claimed that it is no more complicated than the present automobile engine. Kingery is but 19 years old.

10,000 Corporations Told to Pay Annual Licenses.

Salem, Or., June 6—Corporation Commissioner Schullerman has notified all foreign and domestic corporations that their annual reports must be submitted, and their annual licenses paid by July 1. Failure to submit either a report or pay the license fee will make them subject to a \$100 fine. He estimates that there are approximately 10,000 corporations in the state who are subject to license fees.
