First Aid For Fainters

Every member of the Washington police force carries when on duty in crowds a pill box full of tiny glass tubes of aromatic spirits of ammonia according to the Popular Science Monthly. These are for reviving persons who faint in the street.

The tubes are about an inch long and slightly more than an eighth of an inch in diameter. Each has a wrapping of absorbent cotton and over this a silk gauze covering.

Slight pressure between the fingers is sufficient to break the tube. The ammonia is promptly absorbed by the cotton about it, which also serves to prevent the sharp particles of glass from doing any harm. Held beneath the nose of the person who has fainted, the fumes of the ammonia soon revive her. The tubes are stored in all the patrol boxes about the city and are carried in patrol wagons and police ambulances.

HANSEN PLAN ILLEGAL

Medford's Vaunted Scheme Knocked Out By Supreme Court

Salem, Sept. 19.—According to an opinion filed by the supreme court today in the Medford bonding cases, the Hansen plan of refinancing the city's paving indebtedness was declared illegal because in conflict with the Bancroft bonding act, and the present outstanding paving and improvement indebtedness declared valid and assessments legal, because contracted in accordance with the Bancroft act. The decisions were rendered in the case of C. D. Colby vs. the city of Medford. Colby brought suit to declare the Hansen plan invalid and also to invalidate the outstanding paving indebtedness contracted under the Bancroft act. In the latter contention William Stailey was an intervener.

The circuit court of this county had decided in favor of the city and the matter had been taken to the supreme court on appeal. Frank Newman represented Colby; and Fred Mears, Evan Reames and Col. Hansen were attorneys for the city.

Deutschland Designer Hangs Self In Prison

Baltimore, Sept. 18.—Gotthelf Prusse, one of the designers of the German merchant submarine Deutschland, who came to Baltimore on the first voyage of that craft, committed suicide in the city jail today by hanging.

Prusse had been imprisoned as an alien enemy. He was arrested for leaving a restricted zone without permission. He was 41 years old and born in Germany.
