TRAINING IS URGED BY SENATORS.

At Least 5,000,000 Men Are Needed To Win War Is Prediction.

Washington, March 26—The war department resolution extending operation of the selective draft act by requiring registration of men reaching 21 years of age since June 5, 1917, was brought up in the senate today, with senator New, of Indiana, speaking in support of his amendment for compulsory training of men between the ages of 19 and 21.

Senator New declared it is impossible to predict the size of the force that will be necessary for the United States to win the war. The debate was brief and no action was taken.

Senator Thomas, of Colorado, said he had been opposed to compulsory military training, but "that his convictions on the subject had undergone a complete change." He believed that it would soon become a national necessity.

The amendment was characterized by Senator Myers, of Montana, as "one of the best and wisest suggestions" that has been made since this country entered the war.

"In my opinion we should now be training 5,000,000 men to protect this country," said Senator Frelinghuysen, of New Jersey.

"Before we win this war we will need 5,000,000 men," asserted Senator Myers.

Mexican Bandits Kill Three In Texas.

Marfa, Texas, March 26—Glenn Neville, 18 years old, was shot seven times, and two Mexican men and one Mexican woman killed in a raid by Mexican bandits on the Neville South ranch 43 miles south of Van Horn, Texas, at 12:30 o'clock this morning. Reports to district military headquarters here early today told of the casualties.

Troops from Ever's ranch arrived at the ranch 300 yards after the raid. The sheriff at Van Horn and a party of citizens left for the ranch at 2 a. m., to take up the trail of the bandits. The bandits looted the ranch and escaped.

Eight Hun Armen Are Killed By Italians.

Rome, March 26—There has been remarkable aerial activity over the lines on the Italian front, the war office announced today. Eight enemy machines were brought down. There has been a lively artillery battle at places between Lake Garda and the Brenta.
