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In Memoriam.

Mrs. Mary A. Moore, wife of Obe Moore of Doty, Washington, and youngest daughter of Mr. and Mrs. D. W. Bagshaw of this city, died of pneumonia following an attack of influenza, at the home of her sister, Mrs. Clyde E. Howey, in Olympia, Washington, Friday morning, January 24, 1919, aged 24 years.

Mary Agnes Bagshaw was born near Bucoda, State of Washington, January 14, 1895, and resided there and at Oakville, in the same state, with her parents until April, 1909, when she accompanied the family to this city where she remained at home until her marriage in November of last year. For several years past she was employed by her father in the printing office in this city and as compositor at the news case she had few equals in the state.

In March 1917, she was elected City Recorder by a large majority and discharged the duties of the office with fidelity and credit. She was the first and only lady ever elected to a municipal office in the city of Jacksonville.

She was married November 9, 1918, to Mr. Obe Moore of Doty, Wash., and since her marriage she has lived in that state, excepting two weeks at Christmas, which she and her husband spent with her parents in this city. At the time she was taken ill she was helping take care of her sister's family at Olympia, and although given every possible care and attention and in spite of the efforts of three of the best physicians she succumbed to the great destroyer.

Funeral was held Sunday, January 25, at 2:30 P. M. The services at the chapel and cemetery being conducted by Rev. Templeton of the Olympia Presbyterian church. The floral offering were profuse and very beautiful tokens of love and sympathy from the Brotherhood of American Yeomen, Ruth Rebekah Lodge No. 17, of Washington; Alpha May Camp, Royal Neighbors, and from many friends of Mary and of her sister's family. Interment was in the I. O. O. F. cemetery at Olympia.

"Little Mary", as she was affectionately called by many of her friends, was a girl of sterling worth, bright and cheerful in disposition she had a pleasant smile and kind word for every one, old and young alike. She had a rare facility of making friends, seemingly without effort on her part and during her brief sojourn, she helped to make the world brighter for many. She was devoted to her family and in return was loved with an affection which will last beyond the grave. She shall sleep, but not forever; There will come a glorious Dawn. We shall meet to part—no never, O, the Resurrection Morn.
