Widow's Pension Allowed.

Washington, Jan. 25.—A bill granting a pension of \$5000 a year to the widow of Theodore Roosevelt was sent to the White House for the President's approval after being passed today by the House with out a record vote. The bill had been unanimously passed by the Senate.

Before acting on this bill the House passed a similar measure of its own granting the pension by a vote of 250 against 9.

RECURE OIL FROM BIRDS

Inhabitants of the Island of St. Kilda Are Especially Favored in Respect of Light.

The price of coal oil is a matter of no interest to the inhabitants of the Island of St. Kilda, a favorite haunt of that animated oil can, the fulmar, observes the Cincinnati Commercial Tribune. So rich in oil is this sea bird that the natives simply pass a wick through its body and use it as a lamp.

The oil is also one of the principal articles exported from the island. It is found in the birds' stomachs, is amber colored and has a peculiarly nauseous odor. The old birds are said to feed the young with it, and when they are caught or attacked they light themselves by disgorging it.

In St. Kilda it is legal to kill the fulmars only during one week in the year; but during that week from 18,000 to 20,000 birds are destroyed.

The mutton bird of the Antarticle also carries its oil in the stomach and can eject this oil through the nostrils as a means of defense against enemies.

Quantities of mutton birds are slaughtered every year for their oil on the coasts of Tasmania and New Zealand. In its composition and properties this oil closely resembles sperm.
