Enlarged Navy Insisted Upon by President.

Washington, Feb. 4.—Insistence by President Wilson upon the administration's policy of naval expansion led to the unanimous approval given by the house naval committee to another three year construction program. This was disclosed today by Chairman Padgett of the committee when the house began consideration of the \$750,000,000 annual naval appropriation bill.

Mr. Padgett told of a cablegram sent by the president from Paris to Secretary Daniels, saying nothing had occurred over there to change the recommendation he made in his annual message to congress.

The message was brought to the attention of the committee by Mr. Daniels. "The president was very earnest," Representative Padgett said, "and very insistent that the three year program be carried out."

DAHLIA IS MAKING FRIENDS

Once Humble Flower Rapidly Being Brought to High Position by the Master Florists.

The chrysanthemum is not to have everything its own way in the world of flowers. No doubt the chrysanthemum show gets more of the limelight of publicity than a dahlia show, but the gorgeous blossom that was once called "the prim old maid of the flower world" is having its "shows" or exhibitions just the same, and the reports have it that they are attended by large crowds. The dahlia show has become a regular thing in many cities and it is said that there are persons who can work up quite as much enthusiasm for the dahlia as for the "mum." The dahlia, from a very simple and home-loving flower, has become somewhat of a social pet.

It was not many years ago that the dahlia bloomed in the yards of small homes. Sometimes it grew in the front yard and sometimes in the back yard. It might be remarked here that the "yard," especially the "front yard," has disappeared. Nobody now has a front yard. Nobody who is anywhere near up to date would have such a thing about the house. The piece of real estate which we used to call the front yard has become the "lawn."

Well, formerly the dahlia grew only in the yards of humble homes. It had not broken into what is called "society." Fashionable "grounds" could not think of admitting such a plain, hardy and highly colored citizen of the flower world as a mere dahlia. It did not belong to their set. But the merit of this flower and the high state of culture which it has attained under the guidance and tuition of master florists has forced the proudest gardeners to open their gates or let down their fences. The dahlia now holds up its stately head among the exclusive set of tuberoses, gladiolas, carnations and the like.

Primitive Station.

There is in England a railway station which has only one train each way a week—at Blackwell Mill, situated midway between Miller's Dale and Buxton. Blackwell Mill consists of eight workmen's cottages on the banks of the Wye. They are occupied by railway workmen, and it is for the convenience of the wives who wish to journey to Buxton for marketing that on Friday mornings the 9:10 train from Miller's Dale stops at Blackwell Mill. The two uncovered platforms of the "station" are of the length of a railway coach, and composed of rough stone and gravel. The "waiting room" is a platelayer's hut, where the travelers are glad to shelter from the keen wind on winter mornings. The train carries the stationmaster, who distributes the privilege tickets.

Loops the Loop in a Storm at Sea.

Looping the loop in a kite balloon was the hair-raising feat performed some time since by a young balloonist when the government was testing the use of captive balloons on battleships doing convoy work, according to a story in Popular Mechanics Magazine. The balloonist in question had been aloft in his basket several hours because very rough weather when a 40-mile gale struck the fleet.
