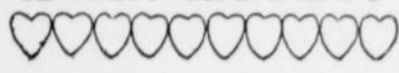

Judge John M. Wilson is presiding.

Attorney George Yantis of Olympia is appearing as counsel for Burnett, who has entered a plea of insanity at the time he killed his wife.
