U. S. Fleet Increases.

Washington, April 14.—America's battle fleet was augmented last month by 10 new destroyers and one submarine besides the superdreadnaught Idaho, which will join Admiral Mayo's forces upon their return from Guantanamo bay, Cuba, within a few days. Five auxiliary ships also were completed in March and present expectations are that more than 150 additional ships will be delivered before the end of the year.

Certificates of Award.

Teachers having pupils who are neither absent nor tardy for the entire school year, may send such pupils names to school superintendent's office and will receive a Certificate of Award for each one.

New School Legislation.

Since the new school laws may not be ready for distribution until late in summer, a few comments upon some of the important measures are here given.

- 1.—The Minimum Salary Law provides that no teacher hereafter be paid less than \$75 a month.
- 2.—The Vocational Act accepts the provisions of the Smith-Hughes Act and will enable high schools to offer students an education that will fit them for an occupation upon completion of the high school course.
- 3.—By another act the compulsory school age is raised to 16 years, and children between 16 and 18 years of age who have not completed the 8th grade must attend a Part Time School.
- 4.—The Minimum School Fund Law provides a minimum fund of \$920 instead of \$400 shall be raised for each district. \$10 instead of \$8 is now required for the county school fund.
- 5.—The county High School Fund Law under which Jackson County has been operating was repealed, and hereafter we will operate under the County High School Tuition Fund Law as outlined on pages 137 to 140 of the 1917 School Laws. This will compel small high schools to maintain standard four year high schools in order to receive tuition.
- 6.—Physical Education is now made compulsory for all pupils in elementary and high schools.
- 7.—Eight grade examinations may hereafter be conducted by the teachers instead of the chairman of the board.
- 8.—One act provides that schools compelled to close on account of an epidemic so as to be unable to hold at least eight months of school during a year, shall not forfeit their share of the county school fund.
- 9.—In order to be released from a contract, a teacher must now give notice in writing at least 60 days before the time set for her school to begin.
- 10.—House Bill No. 78 gives school boards in districts of the first class the right to levy a tax for annual maintenance of school unless the tax exceeds the 9% limitation.

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Changes in League are Senate Victory.

Washington, April 14.—The amendments incorporated in the redrafted league of nations covenant appear on the surface to represent a tremendous victory for the Republican senators who formally served notice on the president that they would prevent ratification of the plan in the form originally submitted.

The revised provisions patently are intended to remove the objections of the 39 Republican senators who signed the Lodge "round robin" and by other Republican and Democratic senators, an aggregation sufficient to defeat ratification.

The president had asserted that the covenant could not and would not be amended.

If the text of the revised articles conforms to the brief official summary of the amendments cabled from Paris it is expected that opposition represented by the "round robin" signers and their sympathizers will dwindle to the point that will assure considerably more than a two-thirds majority for the covenant.

Call for Recruits Out.

Denver, April 13.—Orders were received yesterday by the local United States army recruiting office to open enlistments at once for immediate service in the Panama canal zone, the Hawaiian islands and the Philippines. Enlistments will be for a period of three years.

Flies From San Diego to Fort Worth in 10 Hours.

Fort Worth, Tex., April 15.—Major Theodore MacAuley, commander at Tulliferro field, near here, established what is believed to be a world's record in aviation by flying from Rockwell field, San Diego, Cal., to Tulliferro field in 10 hours and 10 minutes.
