**ELECTION RETURNS.**

County returns available up to the time of going to press indicate that Gen. Wood carried Jackson county by a small majority, but lost the state to Johnson. Ben Sheldon and E. V. Carter will probably be nominated as representatives and for joint representative W. H. Gars has a slight lead over his opponent, Chas. F. Hopkins. In the race for district attorney G. M. Roberts is in the lead by 200 votes. C. E. Terrill will be nominated sheriff by a plurality of at least 400 and Court Hall is leading for county commissioner.

Miss Susanne Holmes is slightly in the lead for the office of county superintendent with A. J. Hanby a close second. For county treasurer A. C. Walker and W. D. Welsh are running neck and neck with the olds favoring Walker. The Jackson County Road Bond issue will carry by a vote of 2 to 1.
