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## FOR PRESIDENT FOR VICE-PRESIDENT HARDING COOLIDGE

In a supreme court decision written by Justice Burnett and handed down Tuesday morning the \$500,000 road bond issue authorized by the voters of Jackson county at the recent election is declared not valid because it exceeds the 2 per cent limitation fixed by the legislature of 1913. This will greatly delay contemplated road improvements to be paid for out of the bond issue. Fortunately there are available funds sufficient to complete improvement work now under way on the road between this city and Ruch and according to the Mail-Tribune arrangements are being made to proceed with Crater Lake highway improvements, so we may congratulate ourselves on not being hit as hard as we might have been.

Our people will remember that had it not been for timely assistance rendered by the Medford Fire Department, the conflagration, originating in a grass fire, which destroyed a number of buildings on Oregon street last summer might have assumed much greater proportions. It is rather humiliating to depend on neighboring cities for protection in such an emergency, no matter how willingly such assistance may be rendered and a good volunteer fire company organized here would eliminate the necessity of an appeal for outside aid. Let a possible repetition of last years experience find us prepared to cope with the situation in a trained, efficient manner.

Now that both political parties have chosen presidential timber the campaign managers will doubtless resume their favorite sport of forwarding literature to newspapers in carload lots.
