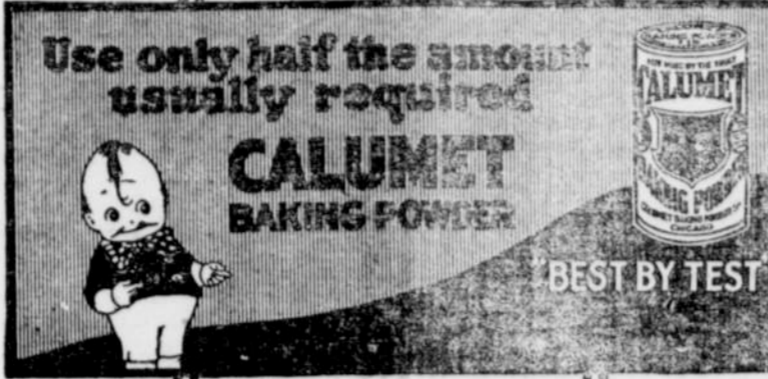
## Hallowe'en Party

Following the program the fortune telling tent, fish pond and the carnival were liberally patronized.

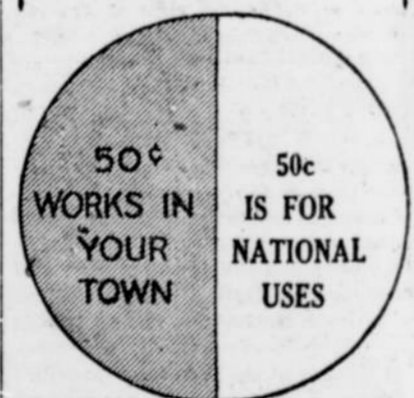
