With an absence of much of the spectacular display that marked previous inaugural ceremonies, Warren G. Harding of Ohio was inaugurated president of the United States, Friday, March 4. President Harding at the beginning of his term is confronted by a mass of knotty problems, many of them calling for immediate solution and all calling for the best efforts of a man of wisdom, energy and practical business ability; a man with not only a thorough knowledge of present day conditions but one who is also able to foresee what the future will bring forth. In the present crisis a great majority of the people have every confidence in the ability of our new chief executive to handle the situation. For the present he has adopted a broad, indefinite policy, under present conditions perhaps the best possible policy to pursue. Most promising of all, he has, as the following list of cabinet members will show, fulfilled a previously expressed intention of surrounding himself with the best minds of the country. Here are the names of men who for the next four years will direct the destinies of the nation:

President, Warren G. Harding; Vice-President, Calvin Coolidge; Secretary of State, Charles Evan Hughes, Secretary of Treasury, Andrew W. Mellon; Secretary of War, John W. Weeks; Secretary of the Navy, Edwin Denby; Secretary of the Interior, Albert B. Fall; Secretary of Agriculture, Henry C. Wallace; Secretary of Commerce, Herbert C. Hoover; Attorney General, Harry M. Daugherty; Postmaster General, Will H. Hays; Secretary of Labor, James J. Davis.

Work on Ditch Begins

The work of building the big Medford irrigation system with its 49 miles of new ditch, 16 miles of enlarging old ditch and constructing 400 or 500 miles of laterals was begun this week at camps 3 and 4 on the high ditch line. Camps 1 and 2 are yet to be established and the work of building the two reservoirs at Fish Lake will not begin for a month or so yet, or until the weather is thoroughly settled in that region. The force of workmen will be gradually increased until its maximum number, about 800, is reached, and work will be continued until the first of the year.

Camp 3 on the high ditch line was established Monday along Jackson creek this side of Jacksonville, and not far from the county seat with 15 or 20 men and about 30 teams and complement of graders, scrapers and the like.

Camp 4 was established the same day on the old Madden place near Central Point with 15 men and an adequate number of teams and other equipment. Both camps 3 and 4 are now busy in turning up dirt.

Camp 1 will be established south of the Westerlind orchard as soon as the ground is sufficiently dried out. At the present time this sticky soil is too full of moisture for work to proceed.

Camp 2 will be located at Fish Lake as soon as work can be begun on constructing the two reservoirs.

In addition a steam shovel work camp will soon be established near Phoenix.—Mail Tribune.

LOAN TO RUSSIA EXPIRES

Obligation Contracted by Kerensky Government Now Payable.

Washington, D. C.—Certificates of indebtedness signed by a representative of the Kerensky government of Russia for a loan of \$187,000,000 have expired. The senate was informed by Secretary Houston. The obligation therefore is a demand one, he added, with interest and principal payable immediately but no steps have been taken toward collection.

The debt now amounts to more than \$200,000,000, he said.

The information was given in response to a senate resolution and said that the advances had been made to the Russian government for its own purposes.

Teddy Roosevelt Gets Naval Post.

St. Augustine, Fla.—President-elect Harding formally announced the appointment of Edwin Denby, Michigan, as secretary of the navy and Colonel Theodore Roosevelt of New York as assistant secretary. Theodore Roosevelt will make his first appearance in the federal government in the same capacity as that in which his late father started.

Fought Unnecessary Battle.

Very dramatic was the conclusion of the Peninsular war. Wellington had just won his triumph at Toulouse, the casualties on both sides numbering some 15,000, and the armies were rejoicing or sorrowing, when a tired courier rode up to announce that Napoleon had abdicated five days before, and the war was over.

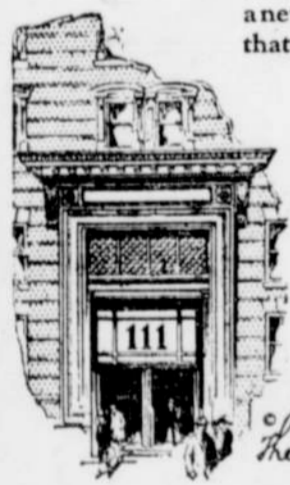
