CONFERENCE ON MANDATES INVITED

Paris.—The council of the League of
Nations, in its reply to the American
note on the mandates question, in-
vites the United States to send a rep-
resentative to the next meeting of the
council, to be held in April. It was
learned here. The reply was cabled

bassy.

American troops arrived at the

to save the president's life.

The attack upon the palace was in-
sulted by men who had become
maddened over a published interview
in which President Porras was quoted
as having declared himself favorable
to a diplomatic settlement with Costa
Rica after Panama had recovered ter-
ritory Costa Rica forces seized last
week. It is asserted the mob which
broke into the palace intended to as-
sassinate Senor Porras.
