## News Items of Local Interest

Another million \$ rain. Mrs. Leora Smith has returned from her California visit.

Lee Wakefield and entire family are down this week with flu or severe colds.

Rev. J. K. Howard of Oakland enjoyed a brief visit with friends here Tuesday.

Dr. Oftedal reports the birth of a fine little daughter on April 19th to Mr. and Mrs. Ross Aubrey of Applegate.

Joe Applebaker has just established a small sawmill on the Margreiter place on upper Little Applegate, for the purpose of cutting railroad ties.

Miss Olga Anderson of Medford is now a stenographer in the sheriff's office—taking the position formerly held by Mrs. McKee, who has returned to her home in Medford.

R. M. Nicholson and wife, from the Gold Hill country, pleaded guilty Wednesday for violation of the prohibition law and Judge Gardner sentenced the former to \$300 fine and 3 months in jail and the latter to \$500 fine and 6 months in jail.

Jas. M. Cronemiller, at his home here yesterday, underwent a serious operation when an unusually large carbuncle was removed from the back of his neck. Dr. Oftedal, assisted by Miss Carmen Dorothy, the nurse, performed the operation.

They are making the trip in their car and will go via Olympia, where they will visit relatives a day or two. The best wishes of their many friends go with them to their new home.

A warning to all motorists that they must have upon their person while driving a machine an operator's license has been given by J. J. McMahon, deputy state traffic officer. Mr. McMahon has received orders from the state department that no exceptions will be made to this rule and all motor vehicle drivers who are found without such a card will be arrested and haled into court.

Our chamber of commerce at a meeting Monday evening decided to celebrate the opening of the new auto park in a manner that will long be remembered by all who take part in it.

A regular old-fashioned basket picnic will be held in the auto park a week from next Monday evening—April 30th—at six o'clock, by the members and their families. ## Power Co. Raises Price of Stock

On May 1 the price of the 7 per cent Preferred Capital Stock of The California Oregon Power Company will be raised, according to H. L. Walther, Division Manager of the Company. About 3600 shares of the present issue which is now selling for \$95 still remain unsold.

On the San Francisco Stock Exchange the stock has been bid for during the last several weeks at \$96. The Power Company is starting on an intensive campaign, advertising the stock in all the newspapers on its system.

"Comparative hydro-electric companies are selling their stock around par" said Mr. Walther. "The advance in the price of our stock is necessary simply because it is worth much more than \$95. We are holding off until May 1 in order to give our customers and friends an opportunity to buy at the lowest possible figure."
